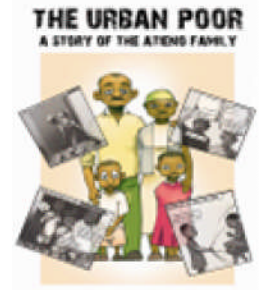

Welcome to IRC Symposium Sanitation for the Urban Poor : Partnerships & Governance

During this three-day event, there will be two key questions for discussion:

- Is the presented approach or methodology well embedded in the urban environment, hence does it have potential to be scaled up?
- Whose shit is it, how is it dealt with it and who foots the bill? In other words, who is going to take responsibility for this shit? Who cares enough to stop the city and its peri-urban borders festering and blighting the lives of all who live there? To put it another way – whose city is this?
