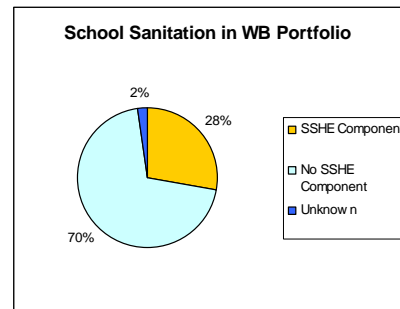
Why HSW in Schools?

- About 2.6 billion people without access to sanitation facilities.
- Diseases related to poor sanitation and water availability are a major source of mortality and morbidity.
- Schools where clean and sanitary facilities are absent contribute to helminth infections and diarrhea.
- Good facilities at school are an important contributor to girls' education



Why a Toolkit?

- Demand from program planners and managers
- Collaboration between Education and Infrastructure Network
- Bringing knowledge of the different sectors together
- School sanitation as a Bank project component – often led by education specialists



Based on review of 47 projects with sanitation and/or wastewater components in the WSS dedicated portfolio, approved between FY00 and FY05.

Objectives of the Toolkit

- To improve the quality and sustainability of hygiene, sanitation and water in schools projects financed under education, health, and water and sanitation projects.
- To provide access to the basic principles and tools for designing, implementing, monitoring, and evaluating hygiene, sanitation, and water in schools

Toolkit Target Audience

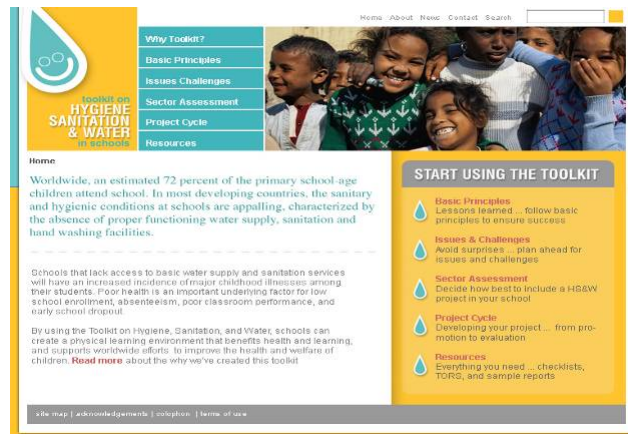
Those responsible for preparing school health components of projects who are unfamiliar with the specific aspects of hygiene, sanitation and water in schools, including:

Design Features of the Toolkit

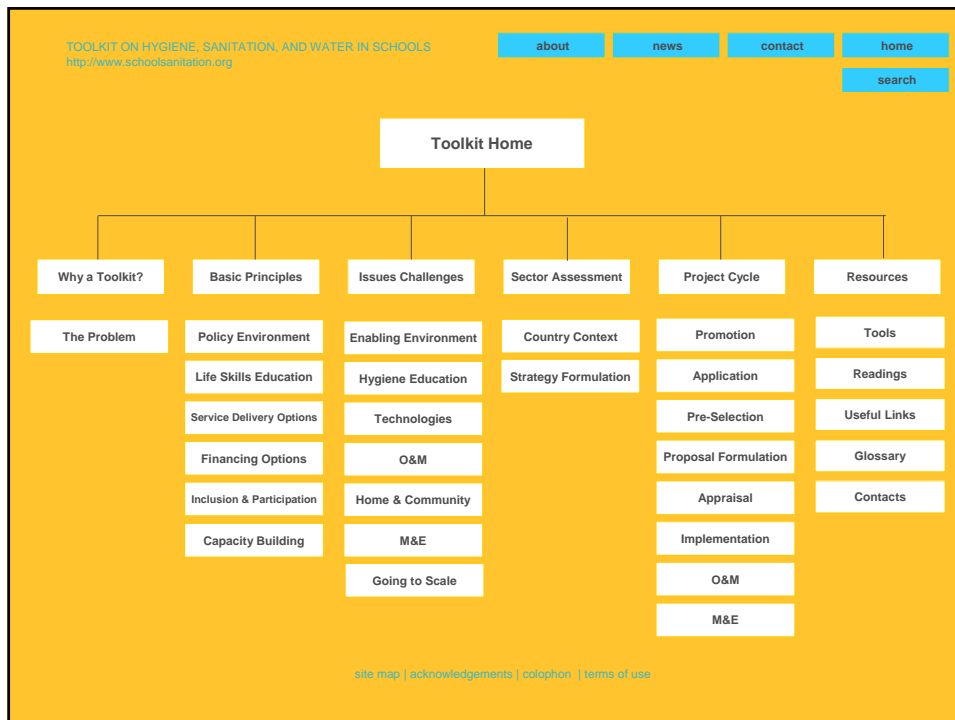
- Accessing relevant information rapidly – within three clicks

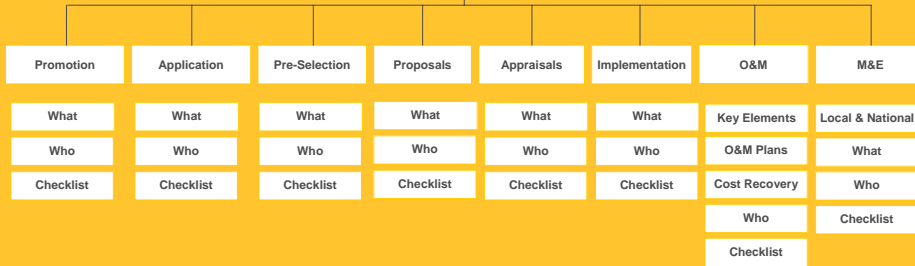

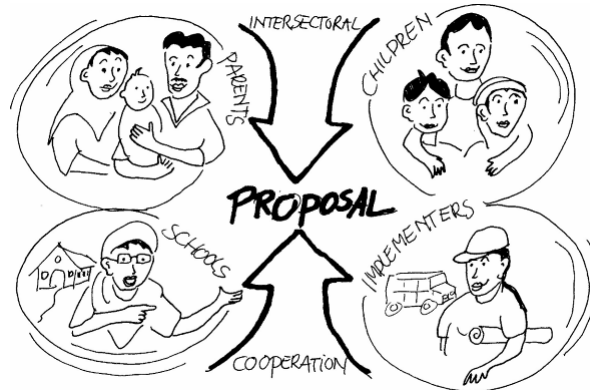
